



Sidmouth is situated in the South West of England which enjoys one of the best climates in the UK. It is also on the Jurassic Coast, a World Heritage Site, and has some of the most beautiful scenery in the country.

#### EXETER

Roman city with university, historic cathedral, museum and Guildhall, excellent shopping centre, quayside visitor centre, Tenpin bowling and more.

### **TOTNES AND DARTMOUTH**

Totnes is a small town famous for its crafts, with boat trips along the beautiful River Dart to Dartmouth and its castle.



### DARTMOOR AND BUCKFASTLEIGH

A scenic and beautiful National Park with wild horses, good walking and visitor centre. Buckfast Abbey is famous for its honey and tonic made by Benedictine monks.

## **PLYMOUTH**

A modern city with excellent shops, Plymouth has the largest naval docks in Europe which the students can view on a boat trip or they can visit the impressive National Marine Aquarium.

# **CLOVELLY AND NORTH DEVON**

The coast of North Devon offers the visitor wonderful views, expansive beaches and picturesque fishing villages such as Clovelly - where donkeys carry goods up the traffic-free cobbled streets. Enjoy the peace and tranquillity of the small ancient port.

# **NATIONAL TRUST PROPERTIES**

Devon boasts a large number of National Trust properties. Students can enjoy beautiful properties such as Knightshayes Court, A La Ronde and Castle Drogo, all within easy access to Sidmouth.

#### IYME REGIS

A small fishing port on the Jurassic Coast. It is famous for its fossils and its literary connections with authors such as Jane Austen and John Fowles. Students can look for their own fossils on the beach.

### **LULWORTH COVE**

This cove includes Durdle Door, a massive rock arch and a world famous geological wonder on the beautiful Jurassic Coast. It is an easy walk to the beach which has caves and exciting rock strata and is good for swimming and snorkelling

# STONEHENGE AND SALISBURY

Stonehenge is a world famous ring of standing stones which date back 5000 years, a place of pagan worship. At Salisbury you can explore the medieval streets and visit the magnificent cathedral.

# TINTAGEL CASTLE AND NORTH CORNWALL

The rugged coast of North Cornwall is famous for its picturesque fishing villages and dramatic sea views. Tintagel Castle is a spectacular place, set high on rocks above the sea. Legends suggest it was the home of King Arthur and the Knights of the Round Table.



## **EDEN PROIECT**

The 'eighth wonder of the world'. The famous Biomes house plants, fruits and flowers.

# **BATH - A WORLD HERITAGE CITY**

Historical spa city with abbey, museums, Roman Baths and ruins, and the famous Pump Room where students can drink the healing waters. Visit the exclusive shops or take an open-top bus ride or a boat trip to see more of this 18th century city

#### **BRISTOI**

A major city and port, once the largest city in England. Historic docks, famous ships, iron suspension bridge, hands-on science centre, Imax cinema, large shopping centre, beautiful cathedral.

### **CARDIFF**

The capital city of Wales, an important port and centre for Welsh Rugby! Visit the impressive Cardiff Castle and have a tour of the Millennium Stadium.

### **CREALY ADVENTURE PARK**

A country park and farm with lots of fun activities; slides, ball pits, log flume etc.

### EXETER

Go Tenpin bowling or visit Clip 'n' Climb (an indoor climbing centre), then have some time shopping in the excellent Princesshay shopping centre.

# SPLASHDOWN AND LULWORTH COVE

An exciting water park provides a day of wet activities for the younger student. On the way home, visit Lulworth Cove and see the spectacular rock arch of Durdle Dor.

# WOODLANDS LEISURE PARK, DARTMOUTH

## **PAIGNTON ZOO**

A wildlife conservation centre for the study of animals and endangered species. This is a fascinating place to spend a day.
